LIEUTENANT COLONEL JESSICA L. ZAMPARINI

Lt Col Jessica Zamparini is Commander of the 36th Force Support Squadron at Andersen AFB, Guam. In this role, she leads 375 personnel providing essential mission support, force readiness, and morale and welfare services across ten flights: Military Personnel, Force Development, Civilian Personnel, Sustainment Services, Military & Family Readiness, Child and Youth Services, Readiness and Plans, Manpower, Resources, and Community Services. 36 FSS programs support over 9,000 military and civilian personnel, three geographically-separated units, as well as 20,000 retirees and their families.

Lt Col Zamparini entered the Air Force in May 2003 as an Air Transportation Apprentice in the Alaska Air National Guard. She completed technical training in November 2003 and completed a bachelor's degree while serving as a Traditional Guardsman. She received her commission in August 2008 through the Reserve Officer's Training Corps, Detachment 1, at the University of Alaska Anchorage. Since commissioning, Lt Col Zamparini has held various squadron, wing, and headquarters level manpower, personnel and services related positions, including commanding a national support element for US personnel at Pápa Air Base, Hungary, among 11 other NATO and Partnership for Peace nations. Her deployments include Operation Enduring Freedom, and NATO's International Security Assistance Force. Prior to her current position, the Lt Col was a student at the Air Force's Air Command and Staff College, Maxwell AFB, Alabama.
