
MEMORANDUM FOR ALL PERSONNEL TRAVELING TO ANDERSEN AIR FORCE BASE (AAFB)

SUBJECT: AAFB Restriction of Movement (ROM) Procedures

1. All Department of Defense (DoD) service members, dependents, DoD Civilian employees, contractors, and all other official visitors traveling to AAFB (collectively referred to as DoD-affiliated personnel) will conduct ROM upon arrival subject to the provisions and exceptions of this memorandum.
2. All DoD-affiliated personnel traveling to AAFB via any means (including military airlift), must coordinate their arrival through their sponsoring unit & with the AAFB Joint Reception Team (JRT) at 671-362-5557, 671-689-1347, and/or 36WG.JRT.ResponseSection@us.af.mil. The JRT will provide inbound personnel the latest 36th Wing COVID-19 mitigation measures during coordination and again upon arrival. All JRT coordination must be initiated and routed no later than seven days prior to arrival.
3. In accordance with Joint Regional Marianas (JRM) policy, DoD-affiliated personnel and their dependents are exempt from post-travel quarantine while on Guam if they:
 - a. Are fully vaccinated, as defined by current CDC guidance and verified by both a CDC COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card and provide proof of vaccination via ASIMS record (or approved equivalent).
 - b. Are fully recovered, as defined by current CDC guidance, from a laboratory confirmed COVID-19 infection within the previous 90 days and verified by both a valid positive COVID-19 PCR test result collected between 10 to 90 days prior to arrival and a clearance letter from a physician or medical provider.
 - c. Present a valid negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test result collected within 72 hours prior to arrival.
4. Non-exempt DoD-affiliated personnel and their dependents will conduct quarantine in accordance with the following provisions:
 - a. Upon approval from the JRT, personnel will conduct quarantine at their residence or a pre-arranged lodging location for 10 days.
 - b. Personnel may be released from quarantine after 7 days if a negative COVID-19 test is obtained within 48 hours of the 7th day.
 - c. Personnel are restricted from accessing workplaces, stores, gyms, recreational facilities, and other public areas. Personnel will coordinate sustainment needs with their sponsoring unit.
 - d. Personnel will not engage in any social or group activities. Personnel may briefly exit their designated quarantine location for essential purposes such as medical emergencies, care for pets, and laundry. Personnel must remain in the vicinity of their quarantine location, maintain six feet of physical distancing from others, wear masks, and maintain good hygiene.
 - e. Personnel will self-monitor for COVID-19 related signs and symptoms as listed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Personnel who develop symptoms will immediately isolate, notify their chain of command, and report symptoms by phone to either 671-366-9355 (366-WELL) for beneficiaries or a local healthcare provider hotline for non-beneficiaries.

5. Commanders may tailor this policy with a Supplemental ROM (S-ROM) (based on pre-departure mitigation measures, travel precautions, pandemic conditions at point of origin, negative test results, etc) to allow visitors to conduct activities on Andersen AFB. The approval authority for S-ROM is no lower than an O-6 assigned to the 36th Wing. The S-ROM policy must be coordinated with the 36 MSG/CC, 36 MDG/CC, and AAFB Public Health Emergency Officer. Any S-ROM policy for transients and personnel of tenant units, including civilians and contractors, must be approved by an O-6 assigned to the 36th Wing.
6. Units operating at AAFB must submit daily ROM situational reports for all personnel in a ROM status to the 36 WG Command Post at 36WG.CP@us.af.mil or 671-366-2981.
7. All personnel must comply with 36th Wing COVID-19 mitigation measures, Joint Region Marianas memorandums and policies and Governor of Guam executive orders.
8. DoD policy requires that military installations, property, and personnel and other individuals working on, residing on, or visiting military installations will be protected under applicable legal authorities and emergency health powers against communicable diseases. Violations of this policy by military personnel may be subject to punishment under Article 92, UCMJ. Failure to comply by civilian employees may result in disciplinary or administrative action. Violations by dependents and contractors may result in administrative sanctions, up to and including barment from base, or loss of command sponsorship for dependents.
9. This memo supersedes the previous AAFB ROM Procedures dated 16 May 2021.
