SUBJECT: Declaration of a Public Health Emergency on Andersen Air Force Base (AAFB)

1. I have extended the Public Health Emergency based on the guidance from our Public Health Emergency Officer (PHEO) given the on-going response on our installation and within the local community of Guam involving Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19). Based on the PHEO's recommendations, emergency health powers for rapid isolation, testing, restriction of movement, and patient information sharing must continue. This declaration is in accordance with DOD Instruction (DoDI) 6200.03, "Public Health Emergency Management (PHEM) Within the DOD," and AFI 10-2519, "Public Health Emergencies and Incidents of Public Health Concern". This declaration will terminate automatically 30 days from the date of this memorandum unless it is renewed and re-reported, or terminated at an earlier time by myself or a delegated senior commander in the chain of command.
2. The installation PHEO and supporting public health, medical and emergency management personnel are hereby directed to identify, confirm, and control this public health emergency utilizing all the necessary means outlined in DoDI 6200.03 and AFI 10-2519. Health Protection Condition (HPCON) level framework will be provided supplemental to this declaration, and 36 Wg guidance will provide specific actions specific to this emergency that each person should take to protect his or her health.
3. The installation command and the PHEO will coordinate activities and share information with Federal, Guam, and Joint Region Marianas health officials responsible for public health and public safety to ensure our response is appropriate for this public health emergency. Shared information may include personally identifiable health information only to the extent necessary to protect the public health and safety.
4. Any person who refuses to obey or otherwise violates an order during this declared public health emergency may be detained. Those not subject to military law may be detained until civil authorities can respond. Violators of procedures, protocols, provisions, or orders issued in conjunction with this public health emergency may be charged with a crime under the Uniform Code of Military Justice and under Section 271 of Title 42, United States Code (U.S.C.). Pursuant to Section 271 of Title 42, U.S.C., violators are subject to a fine up to \$1,000 or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both.
