Lt Col Marc E. Johansen is the Commander, 36th Civil Engineer Squadron, and Base Civil Engineer at Andersen AFB, Guam. The 36 CES consists of approximately 450 military and civilian personnel responsible for facility maintenance, repair, design, construction, fire protection, explosive ordnance disposal, housing, environmental, real property accounting/management, and installation emergency management. The squadron manages 20,780 acres and 2,600 facilities, over 1,200 housing units with an overall plant replacement value of \$7.1 billion.

Lt Col Johansen earned his commission in 2005 through AFROTC Detachment 890, at the University of Virginia, after graduating with a Bachelor's of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering. As a career Civil Engineer Officer, he has held various flight leadership positions at the squadron level, has been a member of the mighty 820th RED HORSE Squadron, and has served on the ACC, AFIMSC, and SOCEUR headquarters staffs. He has deployed five times in support of various exercises and contingency operations. Prior to this assignment, he was the 47th Civil Engineer Squadron Commander and Base Civil Engineer, Laughlin AFB, Texas.
