Lieutenant Colonel Brian B. Neal is the commander of the 36th Operations Support Squadron at Andersen Air Force Base, Guam. The squadron is responsible for all aspects of flying operations in support of the 36th Wing.

Lieutenant Colonel Neal entered the Air Force through Reserve Officer Training Corps in May 2002, after graduating from Montana State University, Bozeman, Montana with a bachelor's degree in Computer Science. He earned his pilot wings from Joint Undergraduate Pilot Training, Laughlin Air Force Base, Texas, in September 2003.

Lieutenant Colonel Neal has served in a variety of operational positions, including Wing Chief of Flight Safety, Chief of Flight Scheduling, and squadron flight evaluator pilot. He has deployed four times in support of both Operation ENDURING FREEDOM and Pacific Air Force's Combined Bomber Presence mission. His staff experience includes three years on the Air Force Global Strike Command Staff as the Standardization and Evaluations Branch Chief, B-1

Functional Area Manager and lead Command B-1 Evaluator Pilot. Prior to his current position, Lieutenant Colonel Neal was the Director of Operations, 28th Operational Support Squadron, Ellsworth Air Force Base, South Dakota.

Lieutenant Colonel Neal is a Command Pilot with more than 3,200 flying hours in both the B-1B and T-6A, logging more than 1500 combat hours in Operation ENDURING FREEDOM.
