Lieutenant Colonel Steven A. Davis serves as Commander of the 36th Communications Squadron at Andersen AFB, Guam. In this capacity, he leads 150 military and civilian personnel dispersed throughout 17 command, control and communications systems facilities. His portfolio includes cybersecurity, cyber and network transport systems, client services, radio and satellite communication platforms, project management, spectrum management and knowledge management, which enable the 36th Wing to execute its mission of "Be Prepared to Execute the Pacing Operational Plan." Lt Col Davis also directs communications equities for 25 annual readiness exercises, as well as strategic Bomber and Tanker Task Force missions across the Joint Region Marianas, supporting Pacific Air Forces and United States Indo-Pacific Command operations.



Prior to serving as the 36th Communications Squadron Commander, Lt Col Davis served as Branch Chief, Portfolio & Project Management, NORAD and USNORTHCOM J6, Peterson SFB, Colorado. As Branch Chief, he was responsible for planning and executing NORAD and USNORTHCOM's \$40M IT budget, supporting 2,500+ users across six geographically-separated, subordinate units. While assigned to NORAD and USNORTHCOM, Lt Col Davis oversaw a \$70M enterprise IT contract and 90 contractors supplying connectivity for the homeland defense mission.

Lt Col Davis earned his Air Force commission from the University of Missouri, Reserve Officer Training Corps program. He has served 15 years on active duty as a Cyberspace Warfare Operations Officer in North Carolina, Afghanistan, Oklahoma, Qatar, Hawaii, Republic of Korea, Germany, Alabama, Colorado and Guam.
