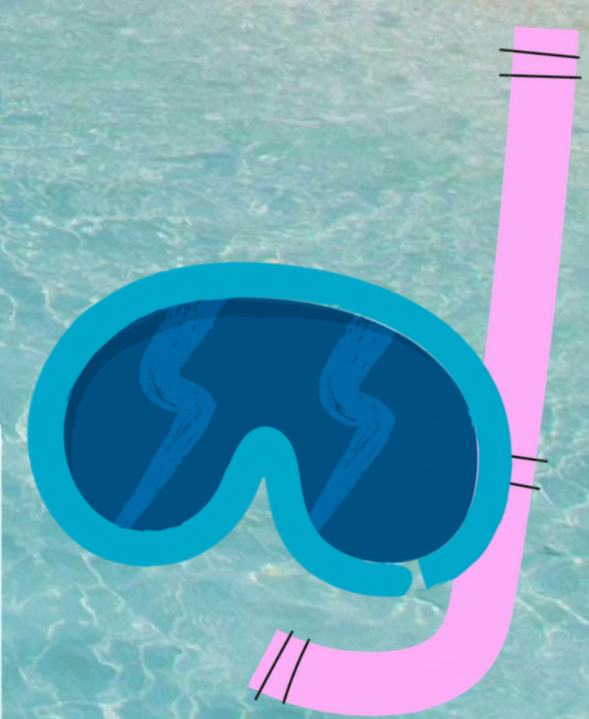

General Order #1

To enhance safety, morale, and good order and discipline on Andersen Air Force Base, the 36 WG/CC has maintained General Order #1 since 5 January 2024, which prohibits, among other things, the abandonment of vehicles and pets.



Pet Relocation Responsibilities and Support

- Relocating pets to/from Guam involves significant costs and legal responsibilities that must be understood prior to PCS.
- Per JTR par. 050107 (current as of 01 Apr 26), members are eligible for up to \$2,000 reimbursement for one animal during an OCONUS PCS.
- If unable to meet financial or care obligations, owners should surrender pets to shelters or friends rather than abandoning them.
- Personnel are encouraged to refrain from acquiring pets if they cannot adequately provide for their long-term needs and relocation costs.



Vehicle Disposal Options and Consequences

- Abandoning any vehicle is illegal and strictly prohibited on Andersen AFB.
- Intentional abandonment carries severe penalties under DoDM 4160.21 Vol 4, including UCMJ violations and pay garnishment.
- Authorized disposal options include selling at the Navy or Andersen Lemon Lot, using Facebook buy-and-sell pages, or selling to dealerships.
- Personnel may also donate vehicles to junkyards or give them away, provided a formal transfer of ownership is completed.

For sponsors, it is strongly recommended to include General Order #1 and information concerning Guam pet ownership/transportation expenses in newcomers' briefings, sponsor materials, or any other correspondence with incoming PCS-ers.



FILING A HOUSEHOLD GOODS CLAIM

Moving can be a hectic experience, and sometimes items get lost or damaged along the way. Fortunately, service members are entitled to compensation.



Handling HHG Crates Impacted by Mold

If your Household Goods (HHG) crates are affected by mold, they will be sent to a local mold remediation company to determine what can be saved and what must be disposed of. Follow up by filing a claim.

Types of Claims and Where to File

1. PERSONAL PROPERTY CLAIM

This claim covers items such as household goods, unaccompanied baggage, non-temporary storage, and direct procurement method moves. You can file these claims through the Defense Personal Property System (DPS).

2. QUICK CLAIM OPTION

Some Transportation Service Providers (TSPs) offer Quick Claim settlements outside of DPS for minor loss or damage. Applying typically at/or immediately following delivery, this option allows for prompt resolution without the need for extensive paperwork.

3. ESSENTIAL ITEM OPTION

Essential items are necessary for everyday living. Examples include refrigerators, medical equipment, mattresses, and washers/dryers. If an essential item is lost or damaged, notify the TSP within seven days of delivery. Possible responses include payment, permanent replacement, or temporary replacement during repairs. For assistance, contact your service's Military Claims Office.

4. RESIDENTIAL DAMAGE

Real Property Damage Claims: If your home is damaged during the move, file a claim directly with the TSP within seven days.

NONJUDIUCIAL PUNISHMENTS

Andersen AFB commanders administered 4 Nonjudicial Punishment actions under Article 15 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) for the following offenses:

Dereliction of Duty; Assimilated Crimes Act: An Amn, who is under the age of 21, blew a 0.072 BAC after being in a vehicle that pulled up to the gate with an open container of alcohol in the car. The Amn received a reduction to the grade of AB, restriction to base for 15 days, 15 extra duty days, and suspended forfeitures of \$1,203.00 for 2 months.

Negligent Discharge: A SrA negligently discharged their service weapon in the armory. The SrA received a reduction to the grade of A1C, a reprimand, and suspended forfeitures of \$1,599.00 for 2 months.

Failure to Obey, Dereliction of Duty; Assimilated Crimes Act: An A1C failed a dorm inspection after several prior warnings. The A1C previously received a NJP for possessing alcohol in the dorm while being under the age of 21 with a portion of the punishment suspended. The commander chose to impose the suspended punishment, reducing the A1C to the grade of Amn, ordering 30 days extra duty, and gave them a reprimand.

Failure to Obey: An A1C violated a no contact order issued by their squadron commander in making several social media accounts and utilizing several phone numbers to contact a former partner. The A1C received a reduction to the grade of Amn, a reprimand, and suspended forfeitures of \$1,348.00 for 2 months.

ADMINISTRATIVE DISCHARGES

Andersen AFB commanders processed 4 Administrative Discharges.

Drug Abuse: An airman was separated with an Under Honorable Conditions (General) service characterization for wrongfully possessing THC vapes.

A Pattern of Misconduct, Conduct Prejudicial to Good Order and Discipline: An airman was separated with an Under Honorable Conditions (General) service characterization for drinking while under the age of 21, driving a vehicle while drunk and possessing an open container of alcohol in a vehicle.

Minor Disciplinary Infractions: An airman was separated with an Under Honorable Conditions (General) service characterization for missing multiple mandatory appointments, being late for duty on multiple occasions, making false statements and losing critical job certifications.

Drug Abuse: An airman was separated with an Under Honorable Conditions (General) service characterization for wrongfully using marijuana.
