Lt Col Adam J. Shockley is the Commander, 36th Contingency Response Support Squadron (CRSS), Andersen Air Force Base, Guam. As the Commander, he leads a diverse team that supports and executes Contingency Response operations, expeditionary training and building partner capacity missions throughout the Indo-Pacific Area of Responsibility. The 36 CRSS includes 30 distinct AFSCs that act as PACAF's sole Air Advisor team and provide contingency response support functions across the Group.



Lt Col Shockley received his commission through Officer Training School in April 2003 after graduating from the University of Lancaster, England, UK. He completed Undergraduate Navigator Training at Randolph AFB, Texas with subsequent flying assignments in Air Mobility Command and Pacific Air Forces. Lt Col Shockley is a graduate of the C-130 Weapons School, Army Command and General Staff College and is a Joint Qualified Officer with staff experience on the Headquarters United States Africa Command's J3 staff. He has held a variety of assignments at the squadron, group, wing and staff levels, to include: chief of safety, assistant director of operations, chief of standardization & evaluation, wing executive officer and USAFRICOM air operations planner. In addition, Lt Col Shockley is a senior navigator with over 2,000 hours and 647 combat hours in the C-130 E/H aircraft. He has supported both combat and humanitarian operations in Operations ODYSSEY LIGHTNING, OAKEN STEEL, ENDURING FREEDOM, IRAQI FREEDOM and TOMODACHI.
