### CHIEF MASTER SERGEANT JOHN C. SPLITTER

Chief Master Sergeant John C. Splitter is the Squadron Superintendent for the 36th Civil Engineer Squadron, Andersen AFB, Guam. In this position, he serves as the principle advisor to the commander on readiness, training, and manpower affecting the utilization and welfare of 450 joint service military and civilian personnel. He also provides leadership to engineers engaged in the maintenance, repair, operations, construction, and fire protection for 7.1 billion dollars in assets covering 20,780 acres, 2,600 facilities, and 1,200 housing units supporting F-22, B-1, B-52, and KC-135 aircraft missions. In addition, Chief Splitter is responsible for the sustainment of the largest jet fuel and munitions storage areas in the United States Air Force.

Chief Master Sergeant Splitter grew up on a large farm in western Kansas and entered the Air Force in December 1994. After completion of Basic Military Training, he attended technical training at Sheppard AFB, TX where he graduated top of his class as an Electrical Power Production Apprentice. During his career he has served at the tactical and operational level of agile combat support in various positions including: Civil Engineering, Fixed Communications, Combat Communications, and Tactical Air Control Party support. He has deployed numerous times in support of Operation SOUTHERN, NORTHERN WATCH, ENDURING FREEDOM, as a Coalition Advisor to the reformed Iraqi Army under IRAQI FREEDOM, and INHERENT RESOLVE.



Chief Master Sergeant Splitter is married to Master Sergeant Casey Jo Splitter and has two children, John Jr. and Alyssa.
